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## internship program

The Internship program provides students with the opportunity to develop as a student leader, social justice educator, and learn more about themselves. CCC Interns develop programs, provide services, and plan events for and about members of historically under-represented groups. They play a critical role in the development and operation of the CCC. Interns learn job-related skills and the importance of teamwork, communication, and personality/working styles.

## social justice education

The Cross-Cultural Center provides social justice education for the UC San Diego Community (students, staff, and faculty) as well as local K-12 and other community organizations. Social Justice Educators (SJE) are student interns that help facilitate trainings, dialogues, and workshops. SJE and Cross-Cultural Center professional staff assist groups and organizations with facilitated dialogues on a variety of topics including, but not limited to, social justice, diversity, communication, teamwork and leadership development.

## outreach and engagement

The CCC engages with campus and community-based groups throughout the year composed mostly of students of differing levels: elementary, middle and high school youth, as well as campus undergraduate students, graduate students, and para-professional staff. Our goal is to connect the UC San Diego and local community to the CCC's resources and provide them with social justice trainings.
